Iowa Plains Title I Program Youth Committee Goals and Objectives (PY23-24)

Objective

At the recommendation of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), the Iowa Plains Title I Program Youth Committee was formed to provide guidance and assistance to the Iowa Plains Title I Program in various aspects related to delivering services to youth.

Goals

The primary aim of the Iowa Plains Title I Program Youth Committee is to address the specific needs of the local community by engaging members from successful community-based organizations and individuals with relevant expertise. The Committee aims to achieve the following objectives:

- Enhance educational attainment among youth
- Equip youth for successful employment
- Foster the development of young people as active citizens and leaders
- Provide support and mentorship to guide youth into adulthood

Membership

Committee members are welcomed based on their experience and expertise in addressing the needs of eligible youth, including those who are not in school. Representatives may come from various sectors such as education, training, health, housing, and justice, as well as philanthropic or community development organizations, and employers. Additionally, parents, participants, and youth may also be included.

The Committee will convene monthly until June 30, 2024 and then quarterly thereafter.

Action Steps

Under the guidance of the Iowa Plains Title I Program, the committee will contribute to the program's success by:

- Providing recommendations on policy direction for program development
- Designing programs to ensure comprehensive services for all youth, including those disconnected from traditional systems
- Facilitating resource leveraging and service coordination among relevant stakeholders
- Organizing local youth activities
- Offering ongoing leadership and support for improving local youth programs
- Assisting with planning and operational aspects of youth service provision.


