- Overview of Work-Experience Program
  - Work experience is a planned, structured learning experience that takes place in a workplace and provides youth with opportunities for career exploration and skill development. A work experience may take place in the private for-profit sector, the non-profit sector, or the public sector.
  - WIOA identifies four types of work experience for youth: summer employment and other employment opportunities available throughout the school year, pre-apprenticeship programs, internships and job shadowing, and on-the-job training.
  - Paid and unpaid work experiences for Youth participants must include academic and occupational education that aligns with their career pathway as a component.
  - Work-Experience does not intend to supplant existing positions or employees.
